Junk car prices can fluctuate based on the market value of scrap. **So check within a few days** of when you are ready to sell.



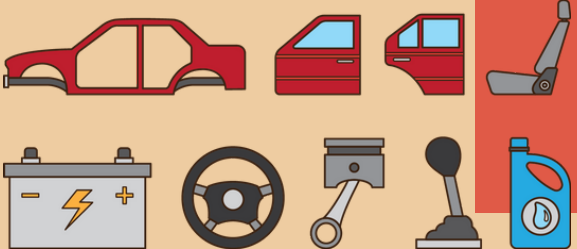

Not all junkyards are created equal. Before junking your old vehicle, make sure you do some research, which junk yard company is best for you and the environment.

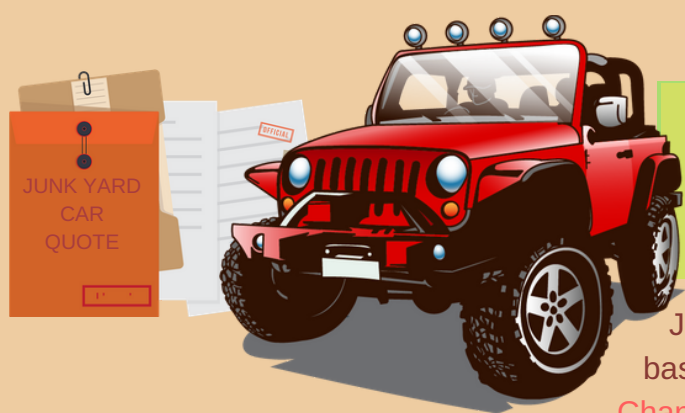
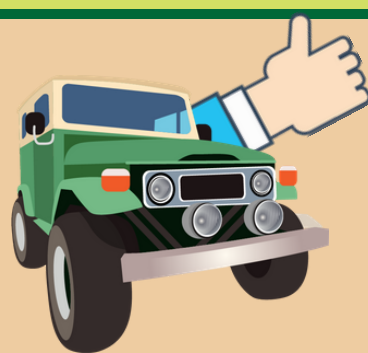


Read reviews, references and recommendations online. Better yet, see these companies in person and have a first hand account on how they treat the cars they get.
